And our whole club, Commissioning Day Committee, guests and program participants did just that. We had a few spittles of rain, but the show went grandly on. A highlight this year was the addition of the bagpiper, Tim Kirkpatrick of the Washington Scottish Pipe Band. He piped down from the gate to the Point, getting the program off on time and ahead of possible showers. After the Mount Vernon Community Band of about 30 players sounded the bugle call and four flams, Master of Ceremonies Jim Hamrick took over.

Commodore Ron Reinsel was truly surprised to be bagpiped in as part of his introduction. "I've never been piped in before," he almost gasped. Then, as the commodore read the names of the two MVYC members who had passed away this year - Norma Jean Poe and Ron Jones - the bagpiper played "Amazing Grace," and a moment of silence was observed.

It was a beautiful scene, and many remarked afterwards how meaningful it was. The Coast Guard Color Guard performed an even smoother than usual flag raising and commissioning, followed by the blessing of the fleet by the Rev. Charles Oberkehr, new pastor of Epiphany Lutheran Church on Old Mill Road.

On The Docks

It's June already and as of mid-May nearly everyone has their boat in the water despite rain, cool temperatures, and wind that only a sailor could love.

Extreme tides backed up by flood waters and winds from the south and east have loaded the marina with drift wood. In fact flood waters covered the point on April 16th loading up the grounds with debris only a week after cleanup day. Volunteers that arrived the next day to help deploy our no wake buoys and channel marker also pitched in to start cleaning up a lot of the wood. I would like to recognize Glenn Stone and his entire family and Jim Gordon for removing a huge amount of debris from the bulkheads and parking lot on Sunday.



The Point, April 16th

The Club's policy on what to do with floating debris has been vague at best. Large floating debris should be pushed out into the creek and be allowed to exit the marina area naturally or towed away if that is necessary. Please do not remove large trees or limbs and stack them on the docks or bulkheads unless you have a chain saw and are prepared to cut them up. Smaller stuff can be placed in the dumpsters, but it must fit inside the dumpster.
