Security

Since the first of the year and up until this writing in mid-April, there have been 25 serious security incidents at the Mount Vernon Yacht Club, most involving trespassing, vandalism, theft and destruction of property. Twelve vessels (including mine-twice) have been broken into, with tens of thousands of dollars of electronics and other boating gear stolen. In most cases, the criminals got into the boats by jimmying locks, and prying open doors and hatch covers. In at least half of these break-ins canvas covers and vinyl windows were slashed. In addition to stealing equipment, the criminals damaged cabling, control gear, and cabinetry as they cut cables and pried out marine electronics and TVs from mounts and cabinets. In some instances, beer and liquor were stolen. In one instance a prowler used the aft deck of one boat as a bathroom. In most of the non-boat-boarding incidents recorded, trespassers encountered by members were chased off the docks and off the property. In one non-boat-boarding incident, dog or human excrement was smeared on the exterior door handle as well as the interior urinal of the Club's Porta-Jon.

Thanks are due to Security Director Jack O'Malley for devising and implementing the security log that provides this critical information. Previously, we had only anecdotal information regarding the severity of the situation, and now we have a better idea of what we're actually up against.


To address this unprecedented rash of crimes, at the last Membership meeting the MVYC Board requested approval for several off-budget security initiatives. The initiatives include: enclosing the perimeter of the grounds with 7' fencing; adding new card-controlled vehicle gates and a pedestrian gate at the parking lot entrance; adding substantial Wi-Fi capabilities extending to the entire Marina and the Point; and installing motion sensors and enhanced lighting around the grounds. The Board's request for approximately \$44,000 was approved and, at the recommendation of the membership, the number was increased by an additional 10% contingency for unforeseen items. The approved total now stands at approximately \$48,000. Details of the approved request can be found on the MVYC web site in the secure area that contains the Membership Meeting minutes.

Until the new perimeter fences, motion detectors and lights are installed, we have engaged Wackenhut Security to provide an overnight security presence at MVYC. Uniformed guards patrol the grounds on foot and are responsible for chasing off trespassers and apprehending anyone engaged in criminal activity. And so that there is no doubt as to our resolve in this effort, we intend to prosecute anyone apprehended while committing crimes on MVYC property. The Wackenhut officers are experienced security personnel who know how to deal with folks who belong on the property as well as those who don't. If you encounter an officer, please remember that they are here to protect us and our property.

Here's where we stand on the improvements:

The Wi-Fi is installed and operating. This gives us the infrastructure for future security camera systems and provides individual members with connectivity to private security systems they might install on their boats. In addition, any club member can bring a laptop to their boat - or to a picnic table - to connect to the Internet.

To get connected, contact Jerry Gray, Mike Holland or any of the club's tech-savvy folks for the encryption key information.

Lighting has been improved throughout the facility. Several motion sensor lights have been installed around the grounds and more will be added; Dominion Electric has replaced lamps and sensors on their utility poles; and the lighting around the pool and at Inner-W dock has been restored to full operation.

In late April, at the parking lot entrance to the grounds, we will be sealing off the property by installing decorative fencing, new vehicle gates, and a new pedestrian gate. An expansion module has been ordered for the current security system to accommodate a pass card reader at the pedestrian gate. If all goes well, MVYC members will be able to use their existing cards to enter the property, either by car or on foot. So please remember to bring your card anytime you intend to enter MVYC grounds.

At this writing we are awaiting Fairfax County's approval of our western property line fence plan which was submitted in late March.

Additional security initiatives include continuing to investigate different types of security camera systems. Also, Jack O'Malley communicates frequently with the Fairfax County Police about incidents at the Club and updates them regarding steps we have taken to improve our situation. Any suggestions you have to improve MVYC security will be greatly appreciated. Please contact Jack, me, or any board member with your ideas.

Don't Forget...

If you haven't already done so, please remember to fill out and return the Census form that you recently received. If you send it in now, you may be able to avoid having a census taker phone you or show up at your door. We all have an interest in assuring that our entire community of boaters is counted when funding allocations are being made to organizations such as the U.S. Coast Guard and NOAA.
